A+B Gallery A+B Gallery presents Obra, a group show focusing on a certain contemporary Spanish painting production, featuring: Elena Alonso (Madrid, 1981), Antonio Ballester Moreno (Madrid, 1977), José Díaz (Madrid, 1981), Julia Huete (Ourense, 1990), Miguel Marina (Madrid, 1989), Kiko Pérez (Vigo, 1982), and Guillermo Pfaff (Barcelona, 1976).

Following the exhibition "Farbe," centered around the German context, the gallery delves into and extrapolates from another specific cultural context a selection of research, primarily unpublished in Italy, in line with the painting research that A+B Gallery has been carrying out in recent years.

The title Obra emphasizes a factual aspect of the act of painting, where points of tension, idea, and material are expressed on the canvas, participating in their own historical and contemporary context.

The artists selected for the Obra exhibition are interconnected considering various cultural data and factors such as belonging to a generational period, primarily covering the Eighties or the late Seventies,


a shared educational path, albeit originating from different Spanish regions, and above all the common geographical area of action, specifically that of the city of Madrid, where the artists have settled and regularly operate in recent years in galleries and city institutions. The exhibition unfolds within the two poles of city and landscape tension - a metaphor for painting itself - and their translation into artificial and natural, synthetic and organic. An artist like Elena Alonso infiltrates her research into architectural artifice, finding space for light and refined painting techniques, just as José Díaz transforms life in the urban structure of the city into a pictorial language. The artifice is total in the synthesis image of Antonio Ballester Moreno, where nature, whether observed in detail or as part of the cosmos, becomes image and abstraction. The tension between the two poles, organic and artificial, is also found in Julia Huete, who arrives at the definition of a painting executed with hidden stitches in organic and evanescent forms. Kiko Pérez, with his collages of paper and

wood, is positioned in that liminal space of


continuous exchange between organic and constructive while Guillermo Pfaff's forms challenge the representational act for a grammar born from the typical material of painting, making his painting an independent act. Decidedly oriented towards nature is Miguel Marina, whose practice does not show a real representation of the landscape, but an individual and fragmented experience of it.

Obra primarily showcases the skill with which artists use pictorial material to create unique expressiveness. Through various techniques, the theme of painting and abstraction is explored, delving into visual language with different grammars and syntaxes.

The exhibition delves into interconnections and relationships, investigating how each artist's works produce visual narratives whose minimum storytelling units emerge through the use of universal forms and unusual materials.




JULIA HUETE


